About HSLC

The Humane Society of Lincoln County, New Mexico is a 501(c)3 organization that was established in 1979 to improve the quality of life of companion animals in our community. The HSLC is an "Open Admission Shelter" that takes in any animal regardless of age, medical condition or temperament. The HSLC works tirelessly toward more animal adoptions, further pet pregnancy prevention, animal rehabilitation and educating the public.

2020 Adoption Numbers

Through October 2020 we have adopted out 478 animals, returned 180 pets to their owners, and have transferred 4 dogs and cats to other animal rescue organizations. Note that our transfer numbers have been impacted this year due to travel restrictions that we instituted as an organization due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

2020 also known as A Year With Some Ups & Downs

2020 was – to put it mildly – a year filled with both celebrations and challenges.

Thanks to fundraising efforts of dozens of HSLC Board members since 2011, several Furr Ball Committees, and literally hundreds of donors who care so much about animal welfare in our community, construction of the new *James Cook Animal Shelter and Adoption Center* on Highway 70 was successfully completed! Our shelter animals and staff moved into the brand new facility last spring.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we were unable to publicly celebrate. Even our annual **Furr Ball** fundraiser had to "go virtual" in July. To make matters worse, our resale shop had to close to the public for nearly three months and, as we write this newsletter, has been closed again until the spread of the virus is contained.

As a result, we have had to suspend our popular life-saving SPOT and TNR programs which provide low cost spay/neuter services for owned pets and community cats. And, like many other small businesses and non-profits nation-wide, our financial condition is being seriously tested.

On the brighter side, animal adoptions are UP! We exceeded our adoption numbers from 2019 even though far fewer animals came into the shelter this year (probably because many more people were staying at home due to the pandemic). In fact, 478 pets were adopted from the shelter through October!

More good news? The pandemic forced us to think outside the box for our fundraising efforts. Our decision to take the Furr Ball online was a bit controversial, but this year's virtual event netted over \$37,000 for the capital campaign and shelter operations & programs! This is equal to our net proceeds of our 2018 in-person event, so our socks were collectively blown off by how successful the event was. It was so successful, in fact, that we are hosting another online event – a PAWliday Store! The estate of one of our loyal supporters, Sally Burkstaller, was bequeathed to the HSLC and many of her beautiful pieces may be found online on our PAWliday Store at https://qtego.net/qlink/humanelincoln

Still more good news: we've begun the "dirt work" for our Memorial Park adjacent to the shelter. More info on this exciting effort may be found inside this newsletter and on our website; we'll keep everyone posted on the progress of our Memorial Park in our e-newsletters!

- Children can learn the important responsibilities of pet ownership (before making the commitment)
- Provide for sick or injured pets so they can live full and happy lives
- Fostering creates space in shelters for other pets in
- Give exposure to these foster pets to potential adopters

Opening your home temporarily to an animal from the Humane Society of Lincoln County is a special way to show your passion for helping animals. Many of the animals looking for foster homes face challenges that can best be overcome with the loving support of our fantastic foster volunteers. Our foster homes also provide us the opportunity to free up more kennels to help even more animals that are in need of immediate care.

As a foster volunteer you may host animals with special

medical or behavioral needs, puppies or kittens under eight weeks of age and in need of special feeding and socialization or mother animals with nursing litters. By fostering a homeless animal, you are providing rehabilitation in a nurturing home environment and directly preparing them for adoption into a loving home.

What are some of the requirements of becoming a foster parent?

- Must be at least 18 years old.
- Ability to lift, push or carry at least 25 pounds.
- Own a car for transporting to veterinary appointments, or in case of an emergency.
- Have a schedule that allows you to meet the needs of foster animals placed in your care.
- Provide proof from your veterinarian that all household pets have current vaccinations or current titer testing.

Resale Shop News

Thanks to the support of our community, our resale shop was off to a great start in 2020 with record breaking revenues. Unfortunately our doors were closed for almost three months due to the Covid-19 outbreak in New Mexico.

We are happy to report that when we once again opened our doors for business, our sales picked right back up. We'd like to thank the HSLC Resale Shop staff for their hard work and our wonderful donors, who have been so supportive of our shop during these difficult times.

Memorial Park Development Now Underway

By mid-December, we should have the last survey completed on the Memorial Park in the front section of our property, east of the parking lot. Next steps after that are to complete plans for the first "zone" of the park, complete with a park bench, tree and at least designs for the walkways that will extend to the Memorial Wall, which should be constructed sometime in the spring.

Generous donors have already contributed to some of the trees, benches, memorial bricks for walkways and tiles which will be affixed to the memorial Wall once complete. Samples and prices are now available for most park components:

WALKWAY BRICKS

Engraved concrete bricks have a smooth surface and beveled edges with spacers on the sides. They come in several sizes and colors. Each Brick & Mortar Member of HSLC will receive a 12 x 12 brick with their membership, literally allowing us to "pave the way" throughout our beautiful Memorial Park. Otherwise, donors can "purchase" Memorial bricks as follows:

- 4" x 8" bricks, for a donation of \$100, will allow for 3 lines of engraving
- 8" x 8" bricks, for \$250, will allow 5 lines of text plus an image or logo and 8 lines without
- 12" x 12" bricks, for \$500, will allow 10 lines of text plus an image or logo.



MEMORIAL TREES

Between 10 and 15 mature trees will be planted in the front section of the Memorial Park, each including a 12" x 12" concrete brick near the tree's base, to memorialize a loved one. Sponsorship of a tree in the Memorial Park is \$1,500.

MEMORIAL BENCHES

Durable, colorful metal benches will be installed in various places in the Memorial Park. Four-foot benches - each with a concrete memorial brick - will be made possible with \$2,000 gift, and six-foot benches will cost \$2,500.



MEMORIAL WALL TILES

Plans for the Memorial Wall will be complete once the survey is completed. The "vision" is to actually construct three walls, with some space between them, so that visitors can enter between them and read the many memorials sponsored by generous HSLC supporters.

Exact materials and sizes have yet to be chosen until the plans for the wall are complete, but we know that the wall tiles will be available in three sizes and colors:

- *Small tiles, for a donation of \$100, will allow for several lines of engraving
- •Medium tiles, for \$250, will allow a few more lines of text plus an image or logo
- *Large tiles, for \$500, will allow even more lines of text plus an image or logo



We have had great support from our community this year. The **Ruidoso Home Center** generously donated furniture for the new shelter: they donated the couch in our reception area, the loveseats for our dog and cat meet & greet areas, a desk for our shelter manager and a table for our staff break room!


Thank you to the Village of Ruidoso, the City of Ruidoso

SPOT & Trap-Neuter-Return Programs Need Your Help!

Our SPOT program (Stop Pet Overpopulation Today) and Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral cats were off to a great start in 2020 – until the pandemic forced the temporary suspension of non-emergency veterinary surgeries. The surgeries resumed after a few months; our SPOT program provided funding for the altering of 54 pets and 152 feral cats have been altered under the TNR program.

Unfortunately these life-saving programs have been put on temporary hold due to lack of funding. We are constantly on the lookout for grant opportunities but have found that the Covid-19 pandemic has created a shortfall of funds with granting

foundations this year.
