About HSLC

The Humane Society of Lincoln County, New Mexico is a 501(c)3 organization that was established in 1979 to improve the quality of life of companion animals in our community. The HSLC is an "Open Admission Shelter" that takes in any animal regardless of age, medical condition or temperament. The HSLC works tirelessly toward more animal adoptions, further pet pregnancy prevention, animal rehabilitation and educating the public.

Adoption Numbers

As of May 1st, 2023, we have adopted out 143 animals, returned 76 pets to their owners, and have transferred 38 dogs and cats to other animal rescue organizations.

What's Happening

HSLC has many fantastic accomplishments so far this year with more to come!

- The animal enrichment area is almost done. New fencing has been installed behind the Shelter. This enclosed area will be a park and play area beside the dog walking path. This will allow the dogs to explore and play while being off leash.
- Constructed an exterior meet and greet area in the front of Shelter.
 Families can enjoy the beautiful weather and shade, while meeting their new prospective forever dog.
- The memorial wall is being completed and an unveiling will be scheduled soon. Installed more secure fencing in the front areas of Shelter.
- · HSLC unveiled our new animal transport van.
- Additional funding was procured for SPOT/TNR programs.
- Completed concrete pad with weather proof covering for dog kennels outside. This allows the dogs to enjoy the beautiful weather but protected from the sun/rain.
- · Working to expand our animal transport program to Colorado rescues.

So many projects are being accomplished due to the support and generous donations from our members and the entire community. None of these important projects could be done without donors as they have ALL been funded by individuals and groups dedicated to saving homeless animals.

I want to welcome 2 new board members to the HSLC Board of Directors. Jeanine Isom, has been so gracious as to have agreed to join our board of

directors as part of our finance committee. Kidie Thornton has also joined us and has taken on the daunting task of communications and is chairing this committee. These ladies come to us with years of valuable experience that will be invaluable to achieve our mission.

Village of Ruidoso New Ordinance

Mandatory requirement that All dogs and cats be microchipped. The chip includes the owner's name, current address, and phone number. Owner is responsible to keep information current.

Current Rabies vaccination will still be required to obtain Microchip or voucher can be obtained at HSLC for Rabies. Bring Rabies vaccination certification to shelter for animal to be microchipped.

This applies to everyone who owes or cares for pets that live within the Village of Ruidoso limits.

Appointments NOT required. Come to shelter during regular hours.

Did you know..... Dogs with microchips are 2.5 times more likely to be returned home. Cats with microchips are 20 times more likely to be returned home.

FUN

It's akin to grand-parenting. Like kids, many animals are quirky and spark joy. All the parenting (animal or human) skills acquired over decades condensed into care-taking, loving, entertaining, and some training: all without the headache of wondering how to manage the next 10 years.

FREEING

Without the stress of managing something 10 years out, true creativity in the day to day round can shine, bring out the best, and create a sense of freedom and joy for both of us.

He is fitting in fantastically!








~ Happy Tails Update on Emory ~
